



Dear Parents and Community Members,

We are going to be studying "Biography" for the next few weeks. Right now we are immersing ourselves in all the biographies we can find and read. We are learning about this important genre in preparation for writing in this same genre later in the unit. Students will choose the subjects of their biographies in the next couple of weeks, and then we will begin our adventure of writing biographies!

There are a lot of ways you can help our class learn about and appreciate biographies. Share a biography you've read and enjoyed in a magazine or newspaper with your student. If you have biographies of favorite figures at home, would you consider sharing those with our class during this unit?

Did someone inspire you when you were younger? Share who that was with our class—we will add the person who inspired you to our bulletin board!

At the end of this immersion week, we will have created a chart titled "Features of Biographies" that we will add to throughout the unit. Here are some other ways you can help:

- Ask your child about the biographies we are reading in class. Who is he or she learning about?
- Read a biography at home and then ask your student for help with understanding the "features" of that book.
- Donate gently used biographies for our classroom collection.
- Volunteer to come read a favorite picture book biography or an excerpt from a biography that is meaningful to you.
- Look for biographical materials wherever you go—ask your student to help you look for and find all the places you may encounter biographies (newsstands, television, movies, etc.).

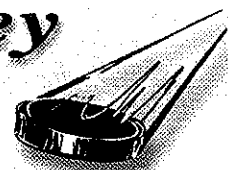
