Regularly Scheduled Safety Drills in Englewood Schools

Dear Englewood Families:

One of our most important responsibilities is ensuring the safety and security of our students. To this end, all Englewood Schools have emergency response plans that identify how staff will respond and how each school will work collaboratively with other agencies (such as fire or police departments) during an emergency situation. Englewood Schools has taken a proactive stance to prepare for situations where an emergency response will be necessary. Drills are a major component of these emergency response plans and are practiced in schools on a regular basis.

We will regularly schedule drills for evacuation, weather safety, and lockdown. During these drills our number one priority is the safety of students and we need your support. Please do not contact the office or interfere with emergency personnel during a drill to find out what is happening. In the event of an actual emergency, it is important that we keep all phone lines clear and all personnel focused on keeping kids safe. In order to use our scheduled drills to better prepare us for an actual emergency, we must treat these drills in the same manner we would during an actual emergency. Additionally, in an effort to develop automatic response behavior, notice of these upcoming drills will not be provided to parents.

If you arrive at the front door and the door is locked with a sign stating the schools is in a lockdown or other emergency situation, you will need to return immediately to the safety of your car or home. School personnel cannot open the locked door for any reason once a lockdown or other safety procedure has begun. In the case of a drill, doors will be unlocked relatively quickly once the full drill procedure is complete. Families will not receive any notification from the school after the drill since these drills are practiced on a routine basis.

In the event of an actual emergency, information will be provided to families via School Messenger emails and phone calls. Important information, including family reunification sites (if needed in the case of an evacuation) will be posted on the District and School web sites and sent to the radio and television stations below.

Hello Charles Hay Teachers & Staff,

I want to introduce the upcoming **Safe Routes to School & Bike Program** at Charles Hay World School. Bicycle Colorado will be visiting the P.E. Specials classes and teaching your students from **September 6-9, 2011**. During that time, we will provide a bicycle and pedestrian safety course to all students. The goal of this program is to encourage getting kids, families and staff active and healthy in a safe, sustainable way. Letters are going home this week with students with program details, but I want to make sure you have the information you need ahead of time as well.

Here is a basic summary of what your students will experience:

For K-1st Grades: Students will receive one day of pedestrian & bicycle safety in PE class.

For 2-5th Grades: Students will spend one day in PE learning about bicycle safety, helmet fit, rules of the road and basic bicycle maintenance. They will then have a second day of on-bike education ("bike rodeo"), where we will set up a bicycle skills course outside and students will spend their class period riding. We bring the bikes and helmets, all the students need to do is show up ready to have fun! We also teach students how to ride without training wheels (in case you have any students who haven't had the chance to learn yet- tell them not to worry!).

The second piece of our program is called **Walkin' & Wheelin' Week**. This is a before-and after-school event, and a chance for us to celebrate what the students have learned and an opportunity to get as many students & staff riding bikes, walking and carpooling to and from school. More details of this event will be provided once a date is set.

We would love to meet you and work with you. Please come introduce yourselves, come ride with your students or ask us about some ways to integrate our program into your regular classroom curriculum! We have many games, ideas and materials for all subjects. Our website has links to lesson plans & other fun ideas: www.SafeRoutesColorado.org. Hello Parents and Students!

I am writing to introduce the upcoming **Safe Routes to School & Bike Program** at Charles Hay World School. Bicycle Colorado will be visiting your children during their P.E. classes from **September 6-9, 2011**. During that time we will provide a bicycle and pedestrian safety course to all students. This past year, your school district received a grant funding this program to encourage getting kids, families and staff active and healthy in a safe, sustainable way.

Here is a summary of the fun we have planned:

- 1) **Education:** Kindergarteners and First-graders will receive one day of pedestrian and bicycle safety in class. Second through fifth graders will spend one day in class learning about bikes and bike safety, and then will spend a second day riding bikes and learning new skills. Bicycle Colorado provides all materials (bikes, helmets, etc.), and we will even have some "glider" bikes to teach students to ride without training wheels (so tell them not to worry if they haven't learned how to ride a two-wheeler yet!).
- 2) **Walkin' & Wheelin' Week:** This encouragement week (date to be announced) is a chance for us to celebrate what your children have learned and an opportunity to get as many students, parents & staff riding bikes, walking and carpooling to school as possible. We are always looking for volunteers and community involvement to make this event a success. We will also set up our bike course after school one day for everyone to try!

We are hoping to make this program a sustainable one, so if you have any questions, concerns or ideas on how we can better reach your family and implement our projects, please pass them on to us. You can start by asking your children what they have been learning in class, what they like about riding bikes or being outside, etc.

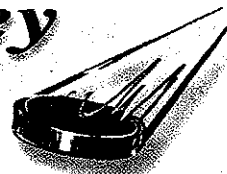

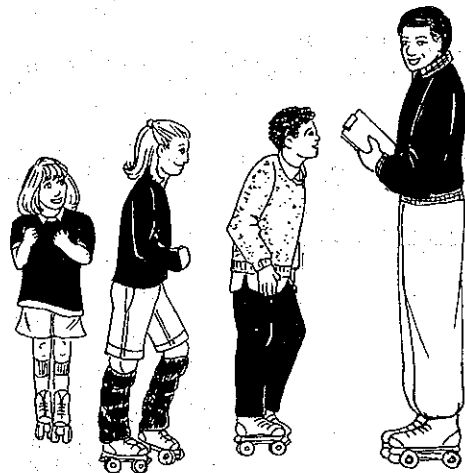
